Please note that the School Calendar included is a provisional one. This is due to the changing advice from the government on return to school and all school guidance related to this.

First Day of Term: The first day of term for First Year students is Monday 31st August. Students should meet in the Assembly hall at 9.00a.m. There will be a full day of school until 4.00p.m. Students are advised to bring a packed lunch and something for small break. Students are not required to have textbooks however a notepad and biro would be useful. First years did not complete their Cat4 Aptitude Tests. In order for these to be completed we will divide the group in two with one doing the assessments and the other becoming familiar with the school - class groups, meeting Year Heads, the allocation of lockers, becoming familiar with the school and activities that will help getting to know other students etc. We will reverse the arrangements in the afternoon.

Lockers: Students who have reserved lockers will also be allocated their locker number so your child should bring a strong lock to put on their locker. Please note that students cannot use any locker other than the one issued to them. From day two onwards students will be required to bring books as per their timetable.

Students are assigned to classes temporarily until we received the Cat4 assessments.

Uniform. School uniform is a compulsory requirement of the Behaviour Code of St. Flannan's College and is an important aspect of school discipline. The uniform for male students is a grey trousers, grey polo shirt, blue jumper both with the school crest and dark shoes. Female students are required to wear either, the school knee length plaid skirt or grey trousers, grey polo shirt, blue jumper both with school crest and dark shoes. Please note white runners are not acceptable neither are grey jeans or grey tracksuit pants. St. Flannan's College school uniform is available from McCannon's, Market Street, Ennis or Pyne's, Abbey Street, Ennis. Students are expected to present in a well groomed manner taking due care that their school uniform is well maintained. Students may wear jackets of their own choice to and from school however students are NOT permitted to wear hoodies in school. Offensive logos or language on clothing will not be tolerated.

Uniform Grants: The Department of Social Welfare supports families who may need assistance through the Back to School Clothing and Footwear Scheme. To avail of this grant please contact the Department directly.



Book Lists: On the first day of term First Year optional subjects will be allocated, so textbooks for those subjects should not be purchased until your son/daughter's subject option has been confirmed.

School Diary: A school homework diary is compulsory for all students and will be distributed to students on the first day of term. It is an important way of tracking homework and Parents/Guardians are requested to sign the diary daily. The cost of the diary is included in the Insurance/Administration contribution. Most students paid this contribution when they accepted their place in the school. Replacing the school diary costs 5 euro if required during the school term.

Online Payments: The school is moving to an online payment system for the coming academic year and beyond. Parents/Guardians will get a text, when payments need to be made. There is a link to this system on the top of the school web site. www.stflannanscollege.ie.

Mobile Phones: Use of mobile phones is not permitted during or between class periods. Please refer to our mobile phone policy on the school web site. Students are not permitted to take photographs of other students or staff, record other students or staff or upload students/staff/school activities onto social network sites. There are serious disciplinary consequences should this happen. If your son/daughter uses social network sites then it is important that Parents/Guardians monitor such sites regularly. It would be greatly appreciated if Parents/Guardians did not contact the school office with messages for students except of course in the case of emergency.

Contact Details: It is important that the school has up to date contact details for every students. Please inform us of any changes of address or telephone number particularly mobile phone numbers as this is critical in the event of an emergency or illness. You will also receive text alerts from the school using the number you have on file. Updated details should be sent by letter or e-mailed. We cannot take updated information over the phone.

Lunch Time: First Year and Second Year students do NOT have permission to go into town at lunch time and must stay on the school grounds where there are canteen facilities. Students may bring their own lunch or purchase lunch. It is in the interest of student care and safety that we do not permit First Year student to leave the grounds. Those students who go home at lunchtime must provide a letter detailing where they will be during lunchtime. Your co-operation is essential in this matter.

Attendance: Regular and punctual attendance for the full school day is vitally important for effective learning and social integration. Students who are late for school and class tend to disrupt the teaching and learning environment for other students. Students who are late must provide a written explanation to their Year head and sign the late book in the school office otherwise they will be recorded as absent.

Smoking: State legislation requires that the school is maintained as a smoke free zone which includes school grounds and facilities. Please be aware that any student found smoking in the school building will automatically incur a three-day suspension from school. Students smoking on the school grounds will incur a one-day suspension. Please note vape and e-cigarettes are included in this Policy.

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Vehicular Access to the School Grounds: Vehicular access to the school grounds is restricted to Staff and College employees only. Please do not drive into the school grounds. Students should be dropped off and collected outside the school grounds. The main gate is not a pedestrian entrance or exit, students should not be dropped off at the main gate. Your co-operation is essential in this matter for the health and safety of all students. Parents/Guardians of students with exceptional needs should contact the school Principal to make access arrangements.

Insurance/Admin & Locker Receipts: have been prepared for monies received. They are available to collect from the office or please contact the school should you wish to have it posted.

Visitors: All visitors including Parents/Guardians must report to reception upon entering the school and sign the visitors' book.

Leaving School for an appointment: If your child needs to attend an appointment during school time please ensure that you provide them with a note from the school diary explaining the time and date of the absence. This should be shown to your child's year head in advance of the appointment and your child will then receive a sign out pass from that Year Head. The Parent/Guardian must come into the school and collect the student and sign them out at the main reception. Upon returning from the appointment the student must sign themselves in at reception. Students must not leave school without being correctly signed out.

- 1) Provide signed note to Year Head explaining absence.
- 2) Get sign-out pass from Year Head.
- *3)* Parent/Guardian must collect and sign out student at reception and give the sign out pass to the secretary.
- 4) If returning the student must sign themselves back in.

Over the past two to three years we in St. Flannan's College have noticed a dramatic change in how incoming first years are accessing technology and how they are using it. When entering first year many students may only in recent months have gained access to their very own phone.
