Discovering Cologne

Our trip began with a guided tour of the beautiful city of Cologne. Students were impressed by the stunning Cologne Cathedral, one of Germany's most iconic landmarks. As we walked through the historic streets, students were able to soak up the atmosphere of this vibrant city and use their German in real-life situations, whether ordering snacks, asking for directions, or shopping for souvenirs.

Meeting Our Partner School

One of the most valuable parts of the trip was our visit to our German partner school, Bettine-von-Arnim in Langenfeld, Ennis Twin Town. Our students were warmly welcomed by their German hosts and took part in a range of activities aimed at helping them to get to know one another. Although there were some initial nerves, activities such as speed-dating and discussions on the theme of 'a day in my life' quickly helped conversations to flow and students soon started to forge connections. Our students were delighted to discover how much German they were able to use in real-life situations. Lunch at the school gave everyone a chance to chat informally and gain an insight into everyday school life in Germany.

Plans are underway to strengthen these initial bonds, including the exchange of local flower seeds and the creation of "partnership gardens" at both schools. Return visits are also being discussed, with the possibility of welcoming our German partners to Ireland as early as this autumn.

Also in attendance were representatives of the Langenfeld Twinning Committee, whose support was instrumental in organising our educational trip, along with the Mayor of Langenfeld, Gerold Wenzens. In his welcome address, Mayor Wenzens emphasised the significance of the twinning partnership, particularly for young people, and paid tribute to the commitment and hard work of the teachers involved.





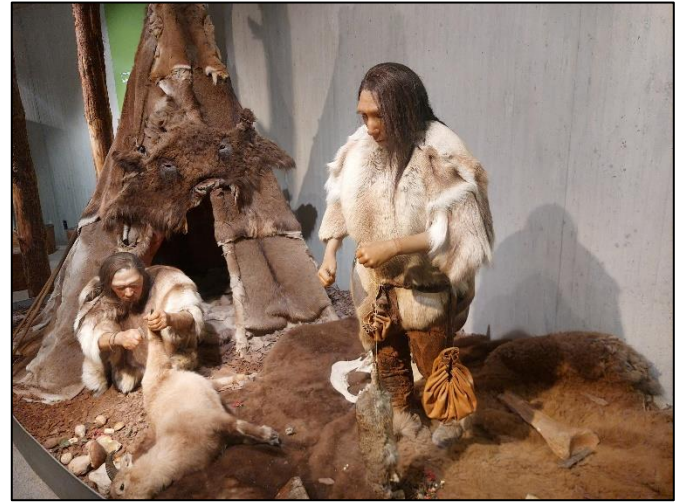

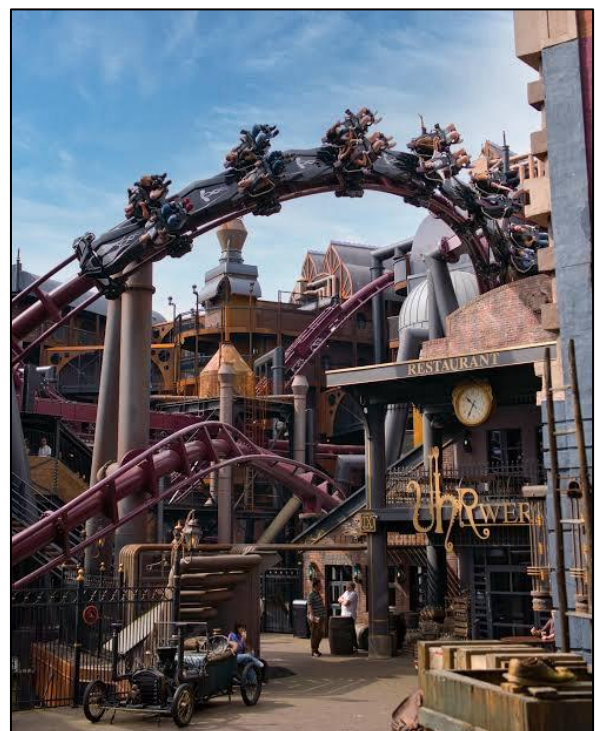
A Journey into Prehistory

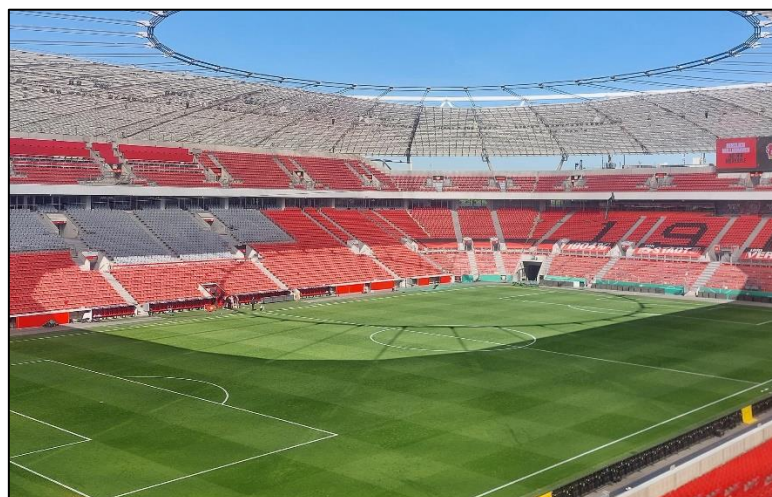
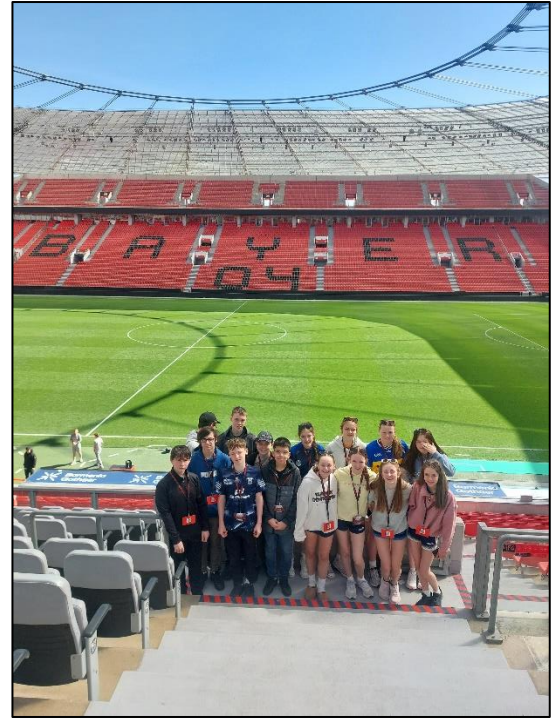
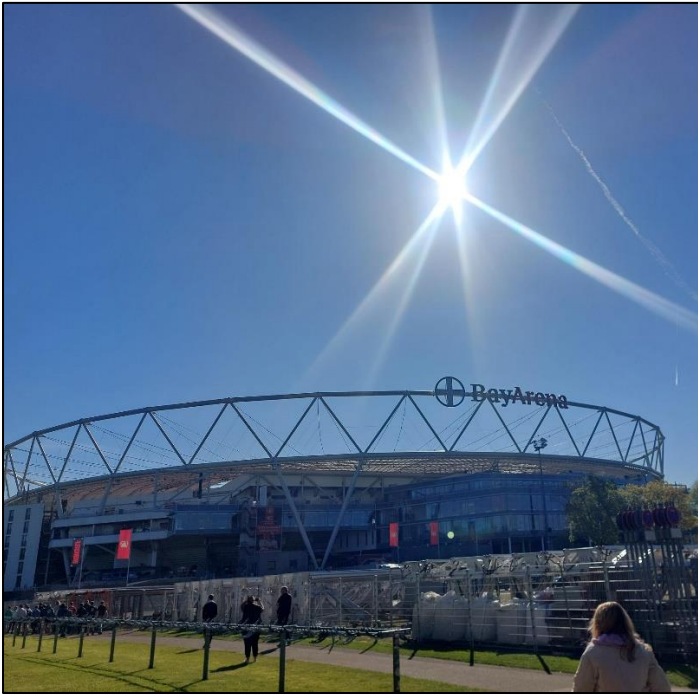
Thrills at Phantasialand
